Chairman's Introduction



I am pleased to introduce this Quarterly Impact Report for October to December 2023. This quarter has seen mixed results. Overall, more than \$200K of pro bono dental care was provided by our fantastically generous volunteers. The Western Australian volunteers have once again performed brilliantly and this quarter have provided the most impact. It is very pleasing that Victoria and Queensland have also performed strongly. The usually highly productive New South Wales has pretty well shut down for now as the ADA New South Wales Branch and its charity Filling the Gap (ADA DHF's partner in NSW) restructure their processes around managing volunteering. I expect NSW will resume strongly soon.

This quarterly result consolidates the 2023 calendar year results so that for 3 years in a row since the COVID-19 shutdown of 2020, our volunteers have provided in excess of \$1.1M of pro bono dental care each year. While this is a great achievement and reflects great credit on the generosity and values of our volunteers, there remains a growing pool of unmet need for our care. It is pleasing that we continue to attract new volunteers although we are not always able to refer them patients due to proximity of patient load issues. The other limitation is of course the Foundation's budget which determines how many days we can employ our State Coordinators. The number of patients we can place is a function of the number of days we can employ the coordinators. It follows that to grow our impact we need more donations each year. We can be proud that our volunteers provide about \$4 of impact for every dollar donated to the Foundation. I doubt there are many charities who can claim that return. So please continue your donations if you already give to ADA DHF or consider doing so if you have not contributed before.

I can also report that the Trustee has approved a new 3-year Strategic Plan for the Foundation for 2024 to 2026. While not anticipating dramatic changes in direction and activity from recent years, it does shift focus to the new name and logo of the Foundation and the increased engagement the ADA, its members and Branches expected to follow from the rebrand. The new Strategic Plan 2024-26 can soon be viewed on the website adadhf.org. A link to this website is included later in the report. To conclude, I once again commend our generous volunteers, our donors and sponsors and dedicated staff who collectively create our impact.

Creating impact with the ADA Dental Health Foundation

Our vision is to enable disadvantaged Australians to have equitable access to quality oral health and care. Through the work that we do, we deliver better access to quality oral health care for all Australians regardless of their financial, geographical or social situation.

From men and women who have overcome addiction, who are enduring long-term economic hardship or suffering from mental and physical health challenges to those establishing their independence after domestic violence has stolen their freedom, and the homeless whose needless dental suffering no longer compounds their more basic struggles, we are there to provide life changing oral health treatment wherever we can help.

Through our Dental Rescue Days®, Adopt a Patient and Rebuilding Smiles® programs, our national team connects eligible individuals with specialist oral health volunteers who provide their time, expertise and practice facilities at no cost to patients.

We also fund programs that facilitate better long-term oral health outcomes through our Healthier Smiles Community Service Grants and Oral Health Education Projects and reduce the inequality of access to education through our Indigenous Study Grants.

To date, we have created change for thousands of community members by enabling the pro bono delivery of more than \$6,000,000 of professional oral health services.

We would like to thank all of our volunteer dental practices who make our programs possible as well as those individuals and companies who generously offer their financial support to our programs.

Volunteer Program Outcomes

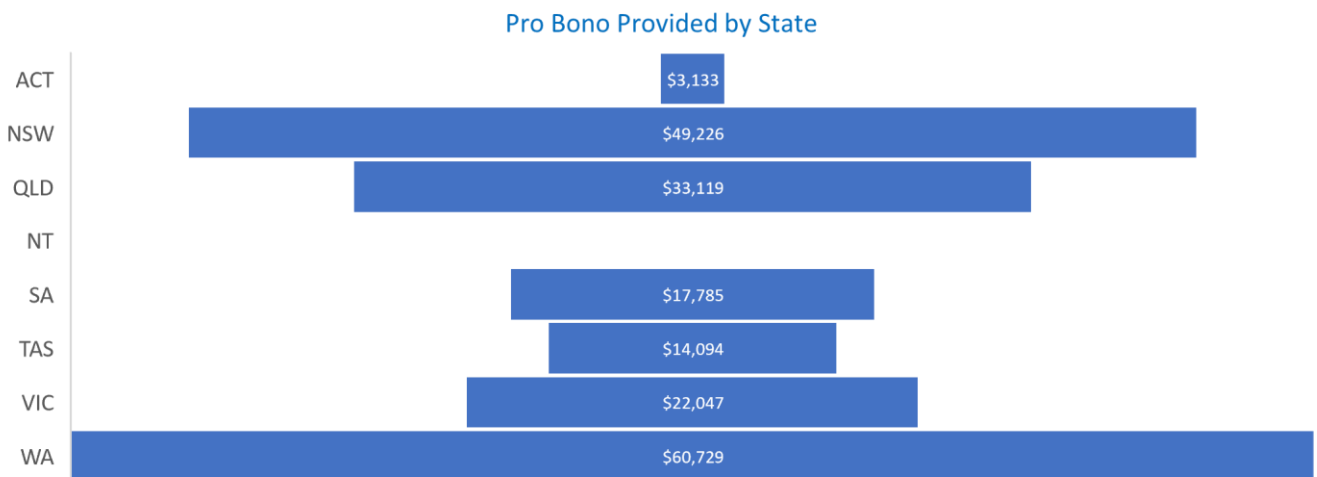
In this second quarter of financial year 2023 (Oct-Dec), the Foundation coordinated **9 Dental Rescue Days®** around Australia, providing **42** appointments to disadvantaged patients. The Dental Rescue Day® program coordinates access to local private practices and clinics for eligible patients, whereby a group of patients will receive a comprehensive general oral check-up in a single day as well as treatment for acute concerns.

197 appointments were attended by patients under the **Adopt a Patient** program. Under this program, an individual patient attends a local private practice or clinic to receive dental treatment and will usually require several appointments to address their often more complex oral health issues. Currently there are **44** patients being treated under the AAP program in practices throughout Australia.

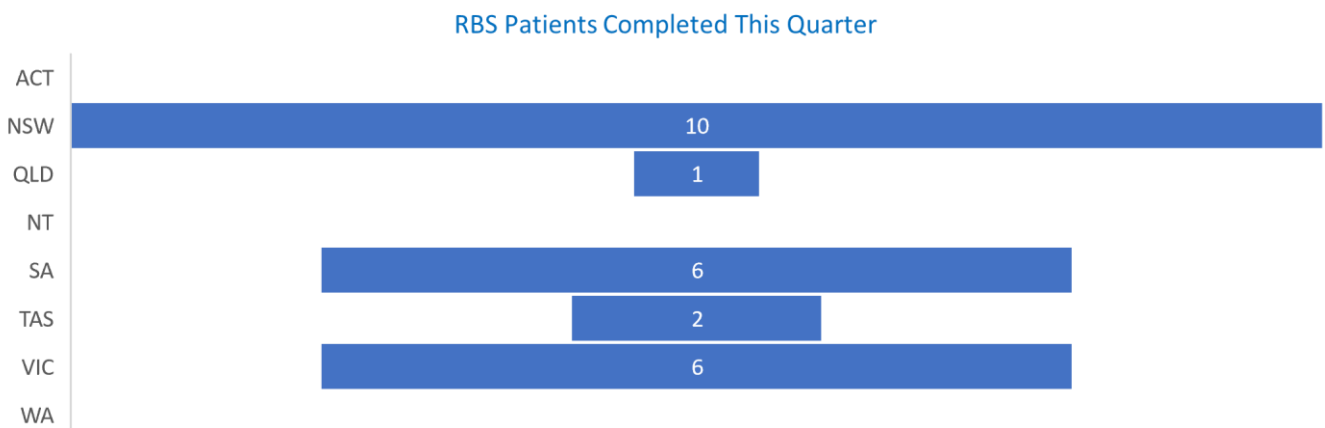
The **Rebuilding Smiles®** program focuses on providing assistance to individuals and families who have experienced family and domestic violence. During this quarter, **25** cases were completed with **59** patients currently connected to a practice or receiving treatment.

Across all three volunteer programs, pro bono treatment of **\$200,133** has been delivered by our volunteer general practitioners and specialists during the quarter

Rebuilding Smiles Completed Cases



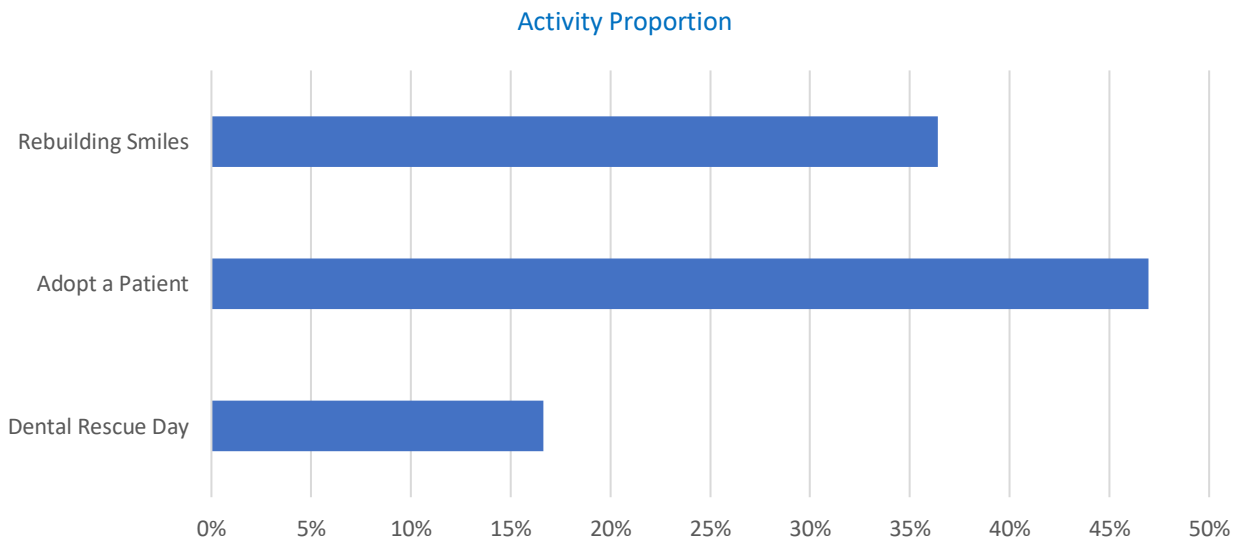
Volunteers

During the quarter, **68 general dentists, prosthetists and specialists** around Australia provided pro bono services to patients. Additionally, many of their staff were involved with coordinating appointments, assisting in surgery and providing oral hygiene and education to patients.

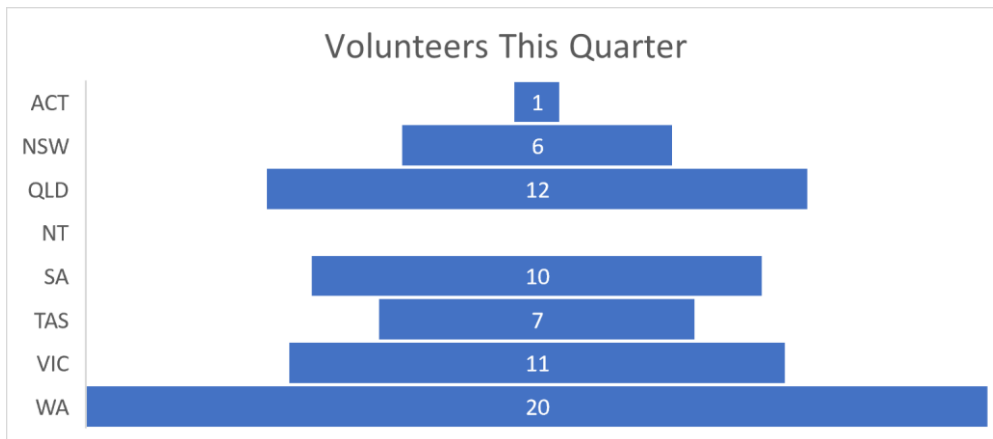
